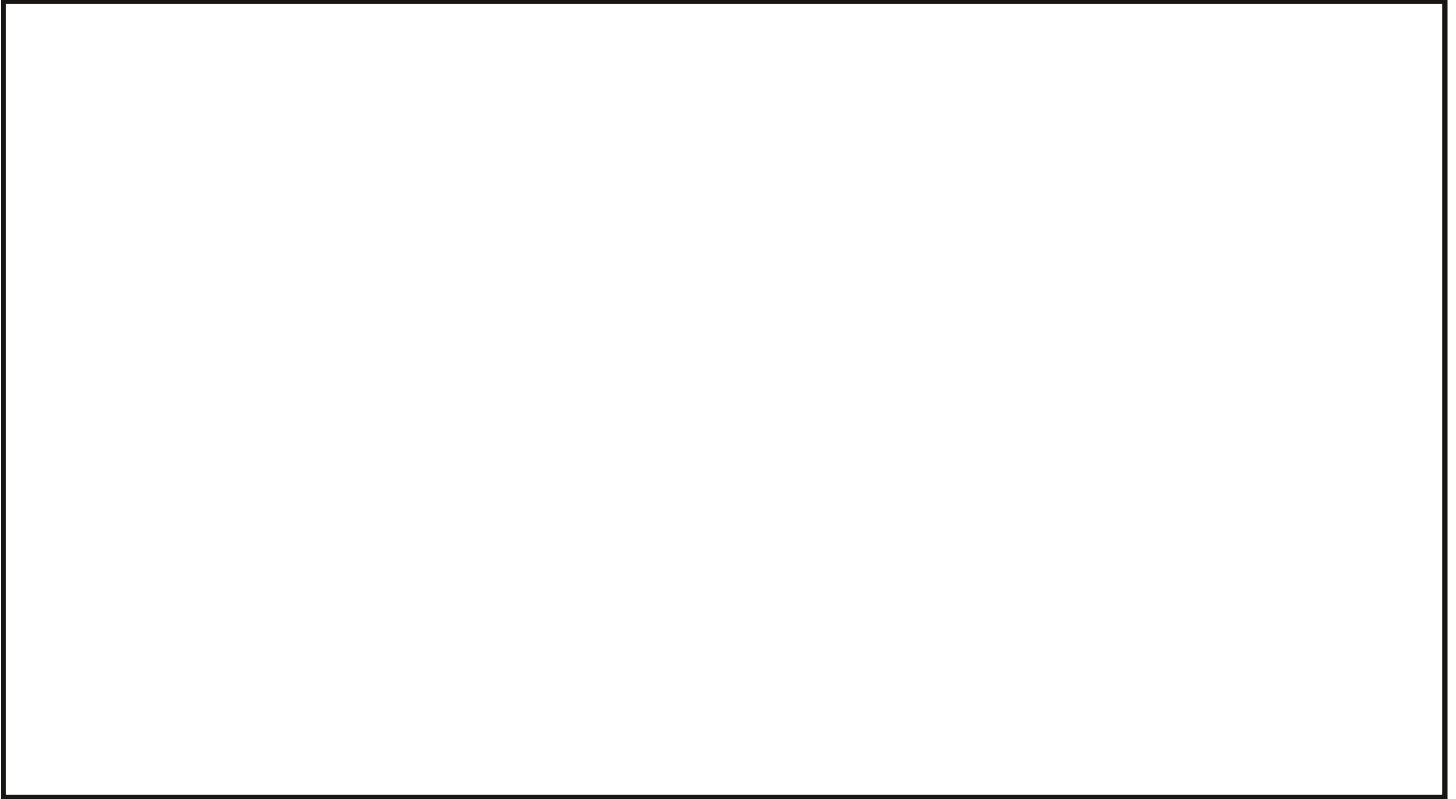


# Animal Evidence



# Evergreen Study



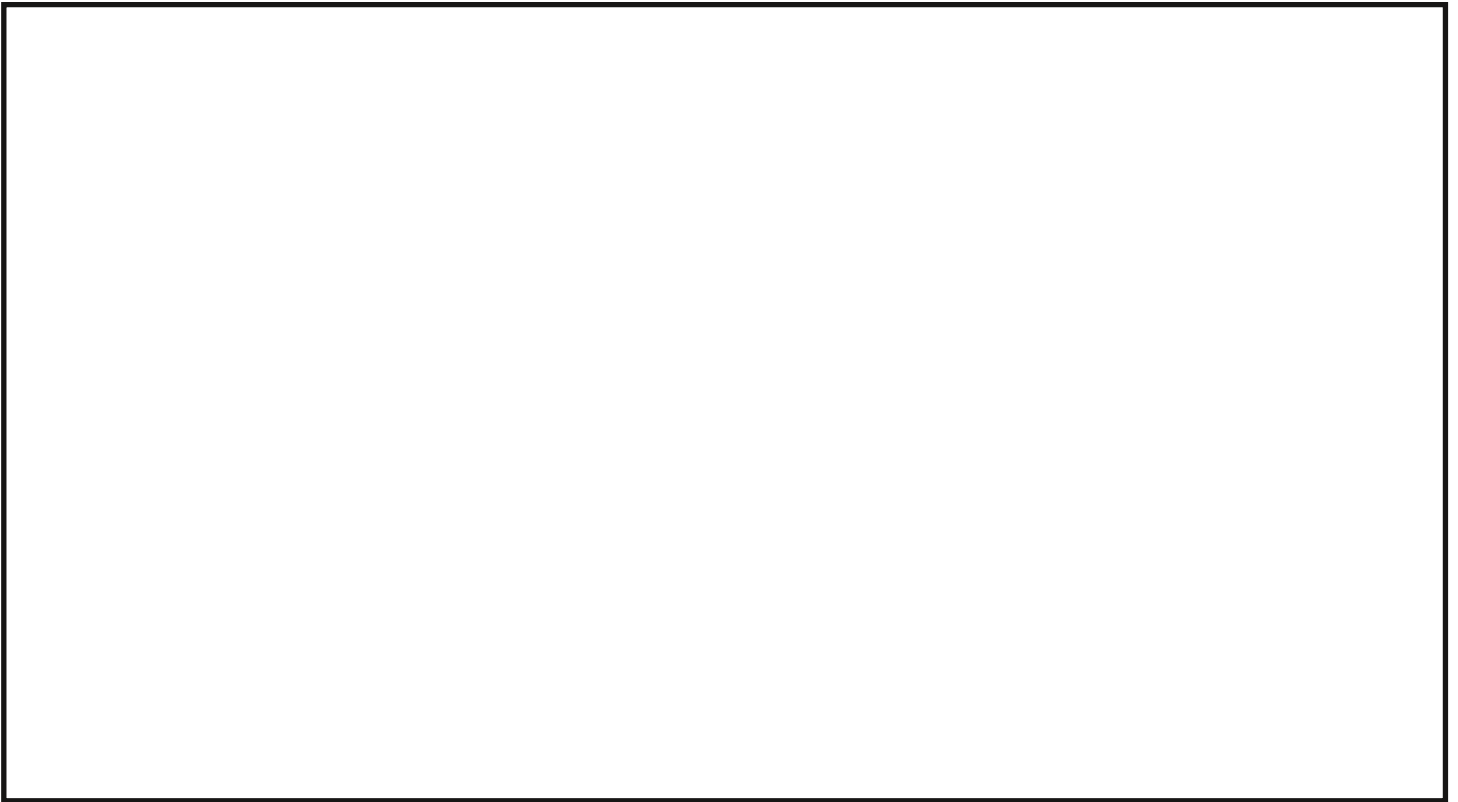
Evergreen trees keep their leaves (or needles) all year. Many evergreens are called conifers. Find an evergreen on a hike or in your yard to study.




